One of the three sites of the Manhattan Project National Historical Park is in Oak Ridge, Tennessee (<u>Oak</u> <u>Ridge, Tennessee - Manhattan Project National Historical Park (U.S. National Park Service) (nps.gov</u>)). Advocates for the Oak Ridge Reservation (AFORR) and the Tennessee Citizens Wilderness Planning (TCWP) are interested in working with the Park Service, the US Department of Energy, and other groups to tie together the landscape and history of Manhattan Project to tell a story about key cultural elements. We also support conservation of elements of the Oak Ridge Reservation and the history of scientific investigation that grew out of the early days of research and development in Oak Ridge. Cultural landscape features of interest include the Three Bends Scenic and Wildlife Management Refuge Area, the Walker Branch Watershed, and various churches and cemeteries located in the Wheat Community and other places throughout the Oak Ridge Reservation.
